# **CERTIFIED COPY - PHOTO ID**

Instructions for applicants



When applying to ESSA, you must provide a certified copy of your photo ID to ESSA. 'Certified copy' means a photocopy of the original document that is signed by an authorised person as a true copy of the original.

#### **ESSA-APPROVED FORMS OF PHOTO IDENTIFICATION**

- » Australian or foreign driver's licence/permit
- » Australian or foreign passport
- » Foreign National Identity Card or Travel Document issued by a foreign government, the United Nations or agency
- » 18+ Proof of Age Card issued by a State or Territory (or equivalent)
- » Student identification card AND Australian or foreign birth certificate or citizenship certificate

# **HOW TO CERTIFY A DOCUMENT**

- 1. Make a copy of the original document (e.g., licence, passport, etc).
- 2. Take the original document and the photocopy to an authorised officer who can certify documents.
- 3. Upload the certified photocopy of your photo ID with your application.

# NOTE FOR AUTHORISED OFFICER

The Authorised Officer must include the following details within their certification statement:

- » Full name
- » Signature
- » Occupation or profession (and occupation/profession number, if relevant)
- » Date of certification
- » Phone number
- » Stamp or Seal (if relevant)

#### **EXAMPLE**

"I certify that this is a true copy of the original and the photograph is a true likeness of the person presenting the document as sighted by me -Authorised officer's name, contact phone number, occupation/profession, profession number (if applicable), date and signature".

# WHO CAN CERTIFY A DOCUMENT

# **DEFINITION OF AUTHORISED PERSONS**

- » a person who is enrolled on the roll of the Supreme Court of a State or Territory, or the High Court of Australia, as a legal practitioner (however described);
- » a person who, under a law of the Commonwealth, a State or Territory, is currently licensed or registered to practise in Australia in an occupation listed in PART 1.
- » a person who is listed in PART 2.

# **PART 1 - OCCUPATIONS**

- » Architect
- » Chiropractor
- » Dentist
- » Financial adviser or financial planner
- » Legal practitioner
- » Medical practitioner
- » Midwife
- » Migration agent registered under Division 3 of Part 3 of the Migration Act 1958
- » Nurse

- » Occupational therapist
- » Optometrist
- Patent attorney
- » Pharmacist
- » Physiotherapist
- » Psychologist
- » Trademarks attorney
- » Veterinary surgeon

#### **PART 2 - OTHER PERSONS**

- » Accountant who is:
  - a fellow of the National Tax Accountants' Association; or
  - a member of Chartered Accountants Australia and New Zealand or the Association of Taxation and Management Accountants; CPA Australia; the Institute of Public Accountants
- » Agent of the Australian Postal Corporation who is in charge of an office supplying postal services to the public
- » APS employee engaged on an ongoing basis with 5 or more years of continuous service who is not specified in another item of this Part
- » Australian Consular Officer or Australian Diplomatic Officer (within the meaning of the Consular Fees Act 1955)
- » Bailiff
- » Bank officer with 5+ continuous years of service
- » Building society officer with 5 or more years of continuous service
- » Chief executive officer of a Commonwealth court

- Clerk of a court
- » Commissioner for Affidavits
- » Commissioner for Declarations
- » Credit union officer with 5 or more years of continuous service
- » Employee of a Commonwealth authority engaged on a permanent basis with 5 or more years of continuous service who is not specified in another item in this Part
- » Employee of the Australian Trade and Investment Commission who is:
  - in a country or place outside Australia; and
  - authorised under paragraph 3(d) of the Consular Fees Act 1955; and
  - exercising the employee's function at that place
- » Employee of the Commonwealth who is:
  - at a place outside Australia; and
  - authorised under paragraph 3(c) of the Consular Fees Act 1955; and
  - exercising the employee's function at that place

- » Engineer who is:
  - a member of Engineers Australia, other than at the grade of student; or
  - a Registered Professional Engineer of Professionals Australia; or
  - registered as an engineer under a law of the Commonwealth, a State or Territory; or
  - registered on the National Engineering Register by Engineers Australia
- » Finance company officer with 5 or more years of continuous service
- » Holder of a statutory office not specified in another item of this Part
- » Judge
- » Justice of the Peace
- » Magistrate
- » Marriage celebrant registered under Subdivision C of Division 1 of Part IV of the Marriage Act 1961
- » Master of a court
- » Member of the Australian Defence Force who is:
  - an officer; or
  - a non-commissioned officer within the meaning of the Defence Force Discipline Act 1982 with 5 or more years of continuous service; or
  - a warrant officer within the meaning of that Act
- » Member of the Australasian Institute of Mining and Metallurgy
- » Member of the Governance Institute of Australia Ltd
- » Member of:
  - the Parliament of the Commonwealth; or
  - the Parliament of a State; or
  - a Territory legislature; or
  - a local government authority

- » Minister of religion registered under Subdivision A of Division 1 of Part IV of the Marriage Act 1961
- » Notary public, including a notary public (however described) exercising functions at a place outside:
  - the Commonwealth; and
  - the external Territories of the Commonwealth
- » Permanent employee of the Australian Postal Corporation with 5 or more years of continuous service who is employed in an office providing postal services to the public
- » Permanent employee of:
  - a State or Territory or a State or Territory authority; or
  - a local government authority;
  - with 5 or more years of continuous service, other than such an employee who is specified in another item of this Part
- Person before whom a statutory declaration may be made under the law of the State or Territory in which the declaration is made
- » Police officer
- » Registrar, or Deputy Registrar, of a court
- » Senior executive employee of a Commonwealth authority
- » Senior executive employee of a State or Territory
- » SES employee of the Commonwealth
- » Sheriff
- » Sheriff's officer
- » Teacher employed on a permanent full-time or part-time basis at a school or tertiary education institution
